Asylum Seekers and Refugees – including refugee resettlement

UK and Bangladesh sign agreement to tackle illegal migration – Home Office

In May the <u>UK and Bangladesh signed a partnership agreement to cooperate on tackling illegal migration</u>. This will enable the UK Government to streamline and speed up the returns process. The work will also facilitate legal migration, tackle visa abuse, strengthen data sharing and capacities, and combat serious organised crime.

Asylum seekers detained for removal to Rwanda – Home Office

In May, the first group of failed asylum seekers were <u>detained in readiness to deport them to Rwanda</u>. The cohort being detained can be removed through existing legislation and do not fall under the Illegal Migration Act, meaning the recent Northern Ireland High Court judgment on the legislation has no impact on current operations to relocate people.

Asylum accommodation and UK-Rwanda partnership - House of Commons Committee of Public Accounts

Following Royal Assent of the Safety of Rwanda Bill in April 2024, the Committee of Public Accounts prepared a report comparing the cost of asylum accommodation (including the Wethersfield site in Essex) with the Rwanda Bill. The Committee makes recommendations including the need for clearer breakdown of costs and feasibility planning; clarity on how the government will ensure the wellbeing of people awaiting relocation; evaluating the local impact; and evaluating whether the policy has a deterrent impact on irregular asylum journeys.

Physical and mental health support for people seeking asylum – Home Office

The Home Office has published <u>guidance for asylum seekers</u> who have concerns about their physical or mental health. It provides contact details for accommodation support service providers, other organisations, domestic abuse and suicide prevention helplines. The guidance is translated into Arabic, Chinese and Pashto.

Report on the impact of age assessments on child asylum seekers – Helen Bamber Foundation & Young Roots The Helen Bamber Foundation and Young Roots drew on focus group discussions to produce a <u>16-page report on</u> <u>the impact of</u> local authority age assessments. A related <u>20-page report</u>, also by the Helen Bamber Foundation and Young Roots, outlines their recommendations to improve the age assessment process using trauma-informed approaches.

Communities for Afghans – Citizens UK

Following community-sponsorship pathways for resettlement of other nationalities, Communities for Afghans is a project delivered in partnership by Sponsor Refugees and the UK Government. Interested groups (of at least six individuals) are invited to register their interest and attend upcoming information sessions throughout June and July. <u>Read more.</u>

New-look Housing Rights website

The Chartered Institute of Housing (CIH) and Metropolitan Thames Valley Housing (MTVH) have unveiled a <u>refreshed version of the Housing Rights website</u>. Housing Rights gives recent arrivals and housing advisers up-todate information about people's rights when looking for a home, based on their immigration status. Coinciding with Refugee Week 2024 (17-23 June), the new website has been designed to improve the user experience and ease navigation so both housing advisers and new arrivals can easily access the information they need.



Home Office data

The Home Office released a number of datasets in this period:

- <u>Statistics on irregular migration</u> for the year ending March 2024.

- <u>Immigration system statistics</u> for the year ending March 2024, covering people coming to the UK, extensions of stay, citizenship, EUSS, asylum, detentions and returns.

- <u>Migration Journey Report 2023</u>, a report on how migrants' leave status changes as they journey through the immigration system.

- National Referral Mechanism and Duty to Notify statistics from quarter January – March 2024.

- Seven-day data on small boat activity in the English Channel (updated weekly).
- <u>Analysis of migrants' use of the Graduate route</u> and what they do after their studies.

DLUHC Ukrainian data

DLUHC has released figures relating to Ukrainian nationals in the UK:

- a count of <u>Ukrainian nationals in employment</u> in the UK, March 2022-March 2024 (disaggregated by age, gender, nation).

- Ukrainian Sponsorship Scheme visa data <u>disaggregated by county, upper and lower tier authority and nation.</u>

- Ukrainian Sponsorship Scheme visa data by age and sex of applicant.

Migration

Video on how to create a UKVI account and access your eVisa – Home Office & UKVI

The Home Office has released a <u>promotional video</u> on creating a UKVI account and accessing users' eVisas. The video is only available in English.

More detailed guidance on eVIsas is also available <u>online</u>. As advised in the previous Newsflash, anyone with a BRP that expires by the end of 2024 will be contacted soon to register for an eVisa. Everyone else will be contacted later in the year. BRP holders and support organisations are encouraged to sign up for updates to the page.

Modern Slavery awareness raising resource – Home Office

The Home Office has updated its <u>resource</u> page to raise awareness of Modern Slavery amongst public sector professionals and partners that might come across victims, enabling them to better spot the signs and report concerns. The resource contains links to videos, external training materials, toolkits and e-learning courses. These are categorised according to their target audience, such as local authorities, health professionals and enforcement teams.

How to Change Minds on Migration – Praxis

Praxis has shared <u>guidance</u> on having impactful, accurate and fact-based discussions on migration with family, friends and colleagues. The guidance highlights the importance of personal stories and positive framing in influencing perceptions. It includes examples and practical tips.

IOM World Migration Report 2024

IOM has published its latest <u>World Migration Report</u>, which provides an overview of global migration trends and developments. The report covers a wide range of topics, including the impact of climate change on migration, security, gender, and mobility after COVID-19. (*Try performing a search using Ctrl+F "united kingdom" or a specific country of origin for specific data and information*). The key data are available in an <u>interactive format</u>, too.

Roma Archive, Peterborough – COMPAS Charity

COMPAS charity in Peterborough have received a grant from the National Trust Heritage to create a Roma Archive. <u>The Roma Archive and Cultural Centre</u> (RACC) will focus on identity, pride, remembrance and solidarity, and aims to create a digital archive of resources, including a podcast and digitised oral histories and artwork, to achieve the charity's goal to "preserve heritage of European Roma migrants".

Research

The impact of migration on UK population growth - The Migration Observatory

The Migration Observatory at the University of Oxford has produced a briefing on the <u>impact of migration on</u> <u>future demographic trends in the UK</u>, based on official estimates and projections. The report finds that migration has been the main driver of population growth in the UK between 2004 and 2022, and projects that migration will account for 92% of population growth until 2046.
